Picture: Black Plague's doctor. Associação Companhia Livre. In the 14th century the Black Plague seemed to be responsible for the death of 1/3 of the European population. The disease is caused by a bacteria transported by fleas in black rats that reach continent through trade vessels. Some of the symptoms are high fever, vomit, delusions, furuncles and black spots, and one could die between 1 and 5 days.

In this scenario the characterization of the plague's doctor is emphasized, dressing long vestments and covering his head with a brim hat. His face is covered by a leather mask, which has glass lens around the eyes and something similar to a bird's beak around his nose.

These doctors are paid by the community, being truly considered due to the knowledge they acquire about the plague.

In Portugal the black plague appears in 1348 and reappears in the following centuries, namely, in a very violent way, in 1569, affecting some neighborhoods in Lisbon. King Sebastian asks for the presence of two Spanish doctors — Tomás Álvares and García de Salzedo. Shortly after they publish a paper about their knowledge of the plague – "Recopilaçam das cousas que conuem guardar se no modo de reservar à Cidade de Lixboa".



EXHIBITION » Lisboa Story Centre

Lisboa Story Centre is a place dedicated to the history of the city which combines knowledge and technology. Throughout 60 minutes, one can travel in time through 20 centuries of Lisbon's memories, since its foundation until nowadays, that intersect with the memories of the country and of the world.

The exhibition has multi-media resources and an immersive scenography.
